**Properties no longer in existence:**

There are 59 definite cases where properties have disappeared either through accident or deliberate action. Some of those we have good knowledge of e.g. Milton Place, Broadstairs, with a plaque: C [builder Culmer] over D S built 1673; and built in flint and brick. It was detached and had gables at both ends with Ch Ped, ogee, Cv, demolished 1910 for road widening. Also 18-19, Watling Street, Canterbury, C17 in red brick, bombed June 1942 from KAS website. Others are only anecdotal. One estimate for Deal losses in WWII alone are 38. There are at least four where through repair or damage the curves have been straightened: Broadstairs, Sandwich and two in Staple. Total: up to 90 lost?

**Victorian Dutch or Flemish Revival:**

From approximately 1849 to 1910 (nearly Queen Victoria's reign) there was a renewal of incorporating curvilinear gables in buildings, particularly in towns and cities and expertly designed by N. Shaw in London especially, but found throughout the country. In Kent there are at least 141 noticed in passing. Furthermore they are still being built occasionally as at London Road, Ramsgate (and Aylsham, Norfolk). They are given a variety of labels in reports (24 at last count) but the heading above is simpler and more accurate.

### Toke & Surrenden Dering families' houses west of Ashford

All with the shaped gable as defined by Pevsner i.e. 'clover leaf' or half round Pediment, Convex under. They are:

Bethersden, Sparrow Hatch, Snoadhill. 1833-66 Four gables. Chilmington Green, Chilmington Farm, C19, one gable. Godington Park, House, 2 x cottages & 2 x gate lodges, C17, C18 & C19, and numerous gables. Great Chart, Swinford Manor School, Mid C19. 5 x gables on C15 or C16 core. Great Chart village has some eight properties of varying dates all with these gables. Hothfield, Swinford Manor, 4 x gables. Little Chart, The Street, C17, The Cottage, & The Gate House C19. Pluckley, Surrenden House & Surrenden Farmhouse – 3 & 1 gable respectively. Pluckley, The Dering Arms public house has no less than 17 gables, c. 1830. Smarden, Pluckley Road, Dering Lodge, Edward VII hunting lodge, 2 x gables plus porch. Shadoxhurst, Old Church School, Church Lane, 1846, 3 x gables.
