THE Society's Library and Museum occupy a couple of rooms at the Maidstone Museum in St. Faith Street, where are preserved its collections comprising objects of interest of the Stone and Bronze Ages, and of the Roman, Jutish and Mediæval Periods. The Library contains a good collection of topographical and other books relating to Kent, as well as the six-inch Ordnance Maps of the whole of the County, on which have been marked all discoveries up to the present time. The Library also includes volumes of "Transactions" of some thirty County and other Antiquarian Societies.

It is hoped that Members who have not already made use of the Library will endeavour to call when in Maidstone. The rooms are ideally situated and well adapted for their purpose, and the outlook in the Brenchley Garden is pleasing at all seasons of the year.

The Rooms are open free to Members from ten to seven o'clock in summer and till sunset in winter.
